I-A. Adam Cycle (Genesis 1-6a)

[*Moses 1*]

God: The Creation

Founding Story of Creation
Commandments Given (Chapter 1)

- Day 1: Sun (1:1-5)*

¹**In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.** ²And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. ³And God said, Let there be light: and there was light. ⁴And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. ⁵And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

- Day 2: Firmament (1:6-8)*

¹⁶And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters. ¹⁷And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so. ¹⁸And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day.

- Day 3: Dry Land and Plant Life (1:9-13)*

¹²And God said, Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry land appear: and it was so. ¹³And God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas: and God saw that it was good.

¹⁴And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so. ¹⁵And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that it was good. ¹⁶And the evening and the morning were the third day.

- Day 4: Lights in Sky: Sun, Moon, and Stars (1:14-19)*

¹²And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years: ¹³And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so. ¹⁴And God made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night: he made the stars also. ¹⁵And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth, ¹⁶And to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness: and God saw that it was good. ¹⁷And the evening and the morning were the fourth day.

- Day 5: Fish and Birds (1:20-23)*

¹⁰And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven. ¹¹And God created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good. ¹²And God blessed them, saying, Be fruitful, and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let fowl multiply in the earth. ¹³And the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

- Day 6: Land Animals and Mankind (1:24-31)*

¹²And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so. ¹³And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle, and every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that it was good.

²⁰And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth. ²¹So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. ²²And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that creepeth upon the earth.

²⁸And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat. ²⁹And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat: and it was so.

³⁰And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

- Day 7: Sabbath Rest (2:1-3)*

²⁷Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. ²⁸And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. ²⁹And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.

Adam & Eve: The Garden and the Fall

Founding Story of Entering the World, Commandment Given and Broken, Cursing (Chapter 2-3)

a. *Adam Placed in Garden, Commanded Not to Eat Tree of Knowledge (2:4-17)*

²⁻³**These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth** when they were created, in the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens. ⁴And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground. ⁵But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground. ⁶And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul. ⁷And the Lord God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed. ⁸And out of the ground made the Lord God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

⁹And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads. ¹⁰The name of the first is Pison: that is it which compasseth the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold: ¹¹And the gold of that land is good: there is bdellium and the onyx stone. ¹²And the name of the second river is Gihon: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia. ¹³And the name of the third river is Hiddekel: that is it which goeth toward the east of Assyria. ¹⁴And the fourth river is Euphrates.

¹⁵And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. ¹⁶And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: ¹⁷But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.

b. *Eve Placed in Garden, Unaware of Nakedness (2:18-25)*

²⁴And the Lord God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him. ²⁵And out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof. ²⁶And Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.

²¹And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof. ²²And the rib, which the Lord God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man. ²³And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man. ²⁴Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh. ²⁵And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.

c. *Adam & Eve Eat Fruit and Discover Nakedness (3:1-7)*

[*Moses 4:1-4*]

¹³Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said unto the woman, Ye hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? ¹⁴And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: ¹⁵But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die. ¹⁶And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: ¹⁷For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

¹⁴And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she ate of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.

⁷And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons.

d. *Where Art Thou? Adam & Eve Ashamed of Nakedness, Admit Eating Fruit (3:8-13)*

³⁴And they heard the voice of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God amongst the trees of the garden.

⁹And the Lord God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou? ¹⁰And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.

¹¹And he said, Who told thee that thou wast naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldest not eat? ¹²And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.

¹³And the Lord God said unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? ¹⁴And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat.

e. *Judgment Cursings, Coats to Cover Nakedness (3:14-24)*

¹⁴And the Lord God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life. ¹⁵And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

¹⁶Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee. ¹⁷And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life: ¹⁸Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field: ¹⁹In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it was thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return. ²⁰And Adam called his wife's name Eve; because she was the mother of all living.

²¹Unto Adam also and to his wife did the Lord God make coats of skins, and clothed them. ²²And the Lord God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever: ²³Therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. ²⁴So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life.

Cain & Abel, Lamech: Murder

Non-Birthright Genealogical List and Stories Standard Broken and Cursing (Chapter 4)

1. Two Sons Born to Eve (4:1-2)

⁶**And Adam [Generation 1] knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain,** and said, I have gotten a man from the Lord. ⁷And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground.

2. Cain Kills Abel (4:3-16)

a. *Lord Rejects Cain's Offering of Produce (4:3-5)*

⁴³And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain [2] brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the Lord. ⁴⁴And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. ⁴⁵And the Lord had respect unto Abel and to his offering: ⁴⁶but unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.

b. *Lord Instructs Cain Not to Sin (4:6-7)*

⁴⁶And the Lord said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen? ⁴⁷If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou dost not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.

c. *Cain Kills Abel (4:8)*

⁴⁸And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him.

d. *Where Is Abel? Cain Denies Knowledge but Is Convicted (4:9-10)*

⁴⁸And the Lord said unto Cain, Where is Abel thy brother? ⁴⁹And the Lord said, I know not: Am I my brother's keeper? ⁵⁰And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground.

e. *Judgment Cursings (4:11-16)*

⁴¹And now art thou cursed from the earth, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand: ⁴²When thou tillest the ground, it shall not henceforth yield unto thee her strength; a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth.

⁴⁰And Cain said unto the Lord, My punishment is greater than I can bear. ⁴¹Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and from thy face shall I be hid, and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and I shall come to pass, that every one that findeth me shall slay me.

¹⁴And the Lord said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold. ¹⁵And the Lord set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him. ¹⁶And Cain went out from the presence of the Lord, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden.

2' Lamech Kills Irad (4:17-24)

⁴¹And Cain [2] knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare Enoch: and he [Cain] builded a city, and called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch.

¹⁴And unto Enoch [3] was born Irad: and Irad [4] begat Mehujael: and Mehujael [5] begat Methusael: and Methusael [6] begat Lamech. ¹⁵And Lamech [7] took unto him two wives: the name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah. ¹⁶And Adah bare Jabal [8]: he was the father of such as dwell in tents, and of such as have cattle. ¹⁷And his brother's name was Jubah: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ. ¹⁸And Zillah, she also bare Tubal-cain [8], an instructor of every artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tubal-cain was Naamah.

- Lamech Kills and Will Be Avenged Like Cain (4:23-24)*

⁴²And Lamech said unto his wives, Adah and Zillah, Hear my voice; ye wives of Lamech, hearken unto my speech: for I have slain a man to my wounding, and a young man to my hurt. ⁴³If Cain [2] shall be avenged sevenfold, truly Lamech [7] seventy and sevenfold.

1' Seth as a Son in Place of Abel, and Seth's Son (4:25-26)

⁴²And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and called his name Seth [2]: For God, said she, hath appointed me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain slew.

²⁰And to Seth, to him also there was born a son; and he called his name Enos [3]: then began men to call upon the name of the Lord.

- General Wickedness of the Sons of God (6:1-8)*

⁶**And it came to pass, when men began to multiply upon the face of the earth,** and daughters were born unto them, ⁷That the sons of God saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took their wives of all which they chose. ⁸And the Lord said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years. ⁹There were giants in the earth in those days; and also after that, when the sons of God came in unto the daughters of men, and they bare children to them, the same became mighty men which were of old, men of renown.

⁵And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. ⁶And it repented the Lord that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him at his heart. ⁷And the Lord said, I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them.

Noah: The Flood

Founding Story of Re-Creation, Commandments and Covenant Given, Standard Broken and Cursing (Chapter 6b-9)

- The Flood (6:9-9:19)*

a. *Lord Plans Re-Creation, Commandment to Build Ark, Covenant Will Be Established With Noah (6:9-22)*

⁶⁹**These are the generations of Noah:** Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God. ⁷⁰And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

¹¹The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence. ¹²And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth. ¹³And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴Make thee an ark of gopher wood; rooms shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt pitch it within and without with pitch. ¹⁵And this is the fashion which thou shalt make it of: The length of the ark shall be three hundred cubits, the breadth of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits. ¹⁶A window shalt thou make to the ark, and in a cubit shalt thou finish it above; and the door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof; with lower, second, and third stories shalt thou make it. ¹⁷And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall die. ¹⁸But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons wives with thee.

b. *Entering the Ark, 7 Days of Warning (7:1-10)*
